CHAPTER 255

AN ACT to amend 153.04 of the statutes, relating to examinations of the board of examiners in optometry.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

153.04 of the statutes is amended to read:

153.04 Licenses to engage in the practice of optometry shall be issued only to persons who successfully pass an examination conducted under the direction of the board of examiners at a time and place fixed by the board. Such examination shall relate to such matters as are essential to the practice of optometry, and shall include anatomy, physiology, pathology of the eyes and its appendages, normal and abnormal refractive, accommodative and muscular conditions and co-ordination of the eyes, and subjective and objective optometry, the principles of lens construction and adjustment and such other subjects as the board * * * *deems necessary. In lieu of its own examination the board may accept, in whole or in part, the certificate of the national board of examiners in optometry.* In case of failure at any examination the applicant shall have the privilege of taking subsequent examinations upon the payment of a fee of \$10 for each examination, at any meeting of the board.
