

CHAPTER 493

AN ACT to amend 147.03, 147.05 and 147.08 of the statutes, relating to the basic science law.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. 147.03 of the statutes is amended to read:

147.03 The governor, with the advice and consent of the senate, shall appoint the state board of examiners in the basic sciences. The board shall consist of 3 lay educators *in the biological or physical sciences*, none of whom shall be on the faculty of any school or of any department thereof teaching methods of treating the sick. The term of office shall be 6 years *and shall expire on June 30, but a member shall continue to serve until his successor has been appointed and qualified.* A vacancy shall be filled for the unexpired term. The board shall elect a president, secretary and treasurer. ~~The compensation of the Members of the board shall be \$10 receive \$25 for each day actually spent in the performance of their duties and actual and necessary expenses.~~

SECTION 2. 147.05 of the statutes is amended to read:

147.05 Application for a certificate of registration in the basic sciences shall be made to the board of examiners ~~in the basic sciences~~, accompanied by ~~sufficient and satisfactory~~ evidence of good moral character *satisfactory to the board and credentials certifying preliminary education equivalent to graduation from an accredited high school of this state, and a fee of ten dollars.* ~~If the applicant was on February 1, 1925, attending a professional school, high school education shall not be required \$20.~~

SECTION 3. 147.08 of the statutes is amended to read:

147.08 The board may issue a certificate to an applicant who presents sufficient and satisfactory evidence of having passed examinations in the basic sciences before a legal examining board or officer of another state, or of a foreign country, if the standards are as high as those of this state, and upon payment of a fee ~~of fifteen dollars which shall be fixed by the board at not less than the reciprocity fee of the state whose certificate the applicant presents; such fee in no event to be less than \$20.~~
