CHAPTER 341, LAWS OF 1967

AN ACT to continue 39.023 (8) of the statutes, as affected by chapter 43, laws of 1967, and to create 39.34 of the statutes, relating to tuition reimbursement for certain courses of study.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 39.023 (8) of the statutes, renumbered from 36.165 (4) and amended by chapter 43, laws of 1967, is not affected by the repeal and recreate of chapter 39 of the statutes by chapter 92, laws of 1967, but is continued as amended by chapter 43, laws of 1967, until June 30, 1968.

SECTION 2. 39.34 of the statutes is created to read:

39.34 TUITION REIMBURSEMENT; CERTAIN COURSES OF STUDY. Any person entitled to exemption from nonresident tuition under s. 36.16 (1) (a) who has completed at least one year of collegiate work and who is attending or has been admitted to an institution of higher education to engage in a first professional degree course of study in veterinary medicine, architecture, forestry or dentistry, or in a course in optometry or dental hygiene conducted by a school accredited under s. 39.30 (1) (d), which is not offered in a Wisconsin public institution of higher education may apply to the commission for the difference between the tuition he is required to pay and the resident fees he would have paid as a resident student at the university of Wisconsin. If the commission determines that the applicant is eligible under this section and that his academic record indicates that he is capable of benefiting from the instruction, the commission may grant the application. No payment for any one individual may exceed \$500 per academic year consisting of 2 academic semesters or 3 academic quarters.

SECTION 3. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the legislature that the creation of section 39.34 of the statutes by this act shall,

on the effective date of this act, supersede the creation of section 39.34 by chapter _____, laws of 1967 (Senate Bill 506).

SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. SECTION 2 of this act shall take effect on passage and publication, but the first tuition reimbursement payments to students who were not eligible for such payments under section 36.165 (4) of the 1965 Wisconsin statutes shall be made for the semester, trimester or quarter which begins on or after the effective date of this act.
