CHAPTER 26, LAWS OF 1969

AN ACT to create 36.47 of the statutes, relating to requiring permission for certain persons to be on public university campuses.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

36.47 of the statutes is created to read:

36.47 REQUIRING PERMISSION FOR PRESENCE ON CAMPUS.

Any person who is convicted of any crime involving danger to property or persons as a result of conduct by him which obstructs or seriously impairs activities run or authorized by a state institution of higher education under this chapter or ch. 37, and who, as a result of such conduct, is in a state of suspension or expulsion from the institution, and who enters property of that institution without permission of the administrative head of the institution or his designee with 2 years, may for each such offense be fined not more than \$500 or imprisoned not more than 6 months, or both.
