

# 1991 Wisconsin Act 46

(Vetoed in Part)

AN ACT relating to the crime laboratories and making appropriations.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

**SECTION 1. Nonstatutory provisions; administration.**

**Vetoed in Part** (1) PAYMENTS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE. From federal moneys appropriated to the department of administration for the office of justice assistance under section 20.505 (6) (b) and (c) of the statutes, the department of administration shall do all of the following:

(a) Pay \$15,000 in fiscal year 1991-92 and \$15,000 in fiscal year 1992-93 to the department of justice to provide training and laboratory supplies for deoxyribonucleic acid testing equipment at the crime laboratories in the cities of Milwaukee and Madison.

(b) Pay \$108,000 in fiscal year 1992-93 to the department of justice for a field response program based at the crime laboratory in the city of Wausau.

**SECTION 2. Appropriation changes; justice.**

**Vetoed in Part** IDENTIFICATION AND PHOTOGRAPHY. In the schedule under section 20.005 (3) of the statutes for the appropriation to the department of justice under section 20.455 (2) (a) of the statutes, as affected by the acts of 1991, the dollar amount is increased by \$110,900 for fiscal year 1991-92 and the dollar amount is increased by \$108,400 for fiscal year 1992-93 for purposes

~~related to identification and photography for the crime laboratory in the city of Wausau and to increase the authorized FTE positions of the department by 3.0 FTE positions on January 1, 1992.~~

**Vetoed in Part**

(2) TRAINING AND LABORATORY SUPPLIES. In the schedule under section 20.005 (3) of the statutes for the appropriation to the department of justice under section 20.455 (2) (a) of the statutes, as affected by the acts of 1991, the dollar amount is increased by \$10,000 for fiscal year 1991-92 and the dollar amount is increased by \$10,000 for fiscal year 1992-93 to provide training and laboratory supplies for deoxyribonucleic acid testing at the crime laboratories in the cities of Milwaukee and Madison.

(3) FIELD RESPONSE PROGRAM. In the schedule under section 20.005 (3) of the statutes for the appropriation to the department of justice under section 20.455 (2) (a) of the statutes, as affected by the acts of 1991, the dollar amount is increased by \$72,000 for fiscal year 1992-93 for a field response program based at the crime laboratory in the city of Wausau.

**SECTION 3. Effective date.** This act takes effect on the 2nd day after publication of 1991 Wisconsin Act .... (Assembly Bill 91).
