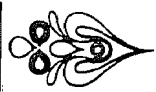

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 67

WHEREAS, a vacancy will exist in the office of the State Representative from the 47th Assembly District, as a result of the resignation of Jonathan B. Barry, whose term of office would have expired on the first Monday in January, 1983;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LEE SHERMAN DREYFUS, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Section 8.50, Wisconsin Statutes, do hereby order that a Special Election, to fill the vacancy, be held on June 30, 1981, in the 47th Assembly District, consisting of parts of Dane, Green and Rock counties, as described in Section 4.16(2), Wisconsin Statutes.

AND, the circulation of nominating papers for partisan and independent candidates may commence on April 21, 1981; the deadline for filing nomination papers for partisan and independent candidates shall be 5:00 P.M., May 5, 1981. The special primary shall be held on June 2, 1981. The election shall be noticed, held, conducted, canvassed and returned in accordance with the law.
