
EXECUTIVE ORDER #11

WHEREAS, State Representative Timothy L. Weeden was elected on April 7, 1987 to represent the Fifteenth Senate District; and

WHEREAS, State Representative Timothy L. Weeden has notified the Governor that he will resign as State Representative from the Forty-Fifth Assembly District effective prior to the date of the special election, pursuant to Wis. Stat. sec. 8.50(4)(e);


NOW, THEREFORE, I, TOMMY G. THOMPSON, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, pursuant to Wis. Stats. sec. 8.50(4), order that a special election be held on June 9, 1987 to fill the vacancy in the Forty-Fifth Assembly District, as described in Wis. Stats. sec. 4.45, for a term expiring the day preceding the first Monday in January, 1989, and that if a primary is necessary, it be held on May 12, 1987. Circulation of nomination papers for candidates may begin on the date of this order and nomination papers may be filed no later than 5:00 p.m., April 14, 1987. The election shall be held, conducted, canvassed and returned in accordance with law.
