EXECUTIVE ORDER # 46

Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin be Flown at Half-Staff as a Mark of Respect for Staff Sergeant Garrick L. Eppinger Jr. of the United States Army Reserve Who Lost His Life While Serving His Country During Operation Enduring Freedom-Afghanistan

WHEREAS, on September 17, 2011, Staff Sergeant Garrick L. Eppinger Jr., a member of the 395th Ordnance Company, 687th Combat Sustainment Support Brigade, 646th Regional Support Group, 310th Expeditionary Sustainment Command, Wausau, WI, died while serving his country in Afghanistan; and

WHEREAS, Staff Sergeant Garrick L. Eppinger Jr. provided faithful and honorable service to the people of the State of Wisconsin and the people of the United States; and


WHEREAS, the people of Wisconsin mourn the death of Staff Sergeant Garrick L. Eppinger Jr.; and

WHEREAS, a memorial service will be held for Staff Sergeant Garrick L. Eppinger Jr. on October 1, 2011;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, SCOTT WALKER, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by federal and state law, do hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin shall be flown at half-staff at all buildings, grounds, and military installations of the State of Wisconsin equipped with such flags beginning at sunrise on **Saturday, October 1, 2011**, and ending at sunset on that date.
