

1995 ASSEMBLY BILL 1085

March 27, 1996 – Introduced by Representatives Cullen, Porter, Carpenter, Hahn and Freese, cosponsored by Senator Moen. Referred to Committee on Urban Education.

AN ACT *to amend* chapter 119 (title), 119.01 and 119.02 (1) and (2) of the statutes;

relating to: reorganizing the Milwaukee Public School System into 5 school
districts and creating a Milwaukee Public School Districts governing board.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Effective July 1, 1998, this bill dissolves the Milwaukee Public Schools (MPS) and creates in its place 5 Milwaukee public school districts. Each new school district must operate grades kindergarten to 12. Each new school board must consist of 7 members elected at large for 4-year terms. The initial election of school board members occurs at the 1998 spring election.

The bill creates a Milwaukee Public School Districts Governing Board consisting of one member of each Milwaukee public school board, and a 5-member Milwaukee Public School Districts Implementation Commission. Commission members are appointed by the state superintendent of public instruction. A majority must be residents of the city of Milwaukee.

By July 1, 1997, the commission must submit to the legislature recommendations on any statutory changes deemed necessary by the commission. The commission must include recommendations on the allocation of the powers and duties of MPS between the Milwaukee Public School Districts Governing Board and the new Milwaukee school boards. The bill directs the commission to assign to the Milwaukee Public School Districts Governing Board only those powers and duties that are best exercised on a city-wide basis.

Finally, the bill requires the state superintendent, by January 1, 1997, to appoint a 15-member advisory council for each new Milwaukee school district. Each council must prepare a plan for the operation of the school district and submit the plan to the appropriate school board when it takes office in July, 1998.



23	specified by the board of school directors of the Milwaukee Public Schools in "Address

Identification Guide", published by the Milwaukee Public Schools' Division of Par-

ent/Student services on August 2, 1994.

- (c) Each of the Milwaukee public school districts created under paragraph (a) shall operate grades kindergarten to 12.
- (d) A school under the jurisdiction of a Milwaukee public school board shall be open to pupils residing within the attendance district established for that school by that school board. If no space is available in that school, a pupil residing within the school's attendance district may attend a public school operating the appropriate grade in any of the 5 Milwaukee public school districts.
- (2) Members of Milwaukee public school boards shall consist of 7 members elected at large by a plurality vote of the electors of each school district. The initial members of the Milwaukee public school boards shall be elected at the 1998 spring election and shall take office on July 1, 1998.
- (b) The initial terms of 4 of the initial members of the Milwaukee school boards shall be 2 years. The initial terms of 3 of the initial members of the Milwaukee school boards shall be 4 years. For the initial election, in filing nomination papers and a declaration of candidacy, each candidate shall specify whether he or she seeks office for a 2-year or a 4-year term. Successors to the initial board members shall serve for 4-year terms.
- (3) MILWAUKEE PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICTS GOVERNING BOARD. There is created a Milwaukee Public School Districts Governing Board consisting of one member of each Milwaukee public school board elected by that school board.
 - (4) MILWAUKEE PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICTS IMPLEMENTATION COMMISSION.
- (a) The state superintendent of public instruction shall appoint a Milwaukee Public School Districts Implementation Commission. The commission shall consist of 5 members, a majority of whom are residents of the city of Milwaukee. The depart-

ment of public instruction shall provide staff services to the commission. Commissioners shall receive no compensation or reimbursement for their services or expenses.

- (b) The Milwaukee Public School Districts Implementation Commission shall submit to the legislature by July 1, 1997, recommendations on statutory changes needed as a result of the creation of the Milwaukee Public School Districts and the Milwaukee Public School Districts Governing Board under this act, on any other statutory changes required to implement this act and on related matters deemed by the commission to be desirable or necessary to organize and operate the school districts created by this act. The commission shall include recommendations on the allocation of the powers and duties of the Milwaukee Public Schools between the Milwaukee Public School Districts Governing Board created under subsection (3) and the Milwaukee public school boards created under subsection (1).
- (c) In its recommendations, the commission shall assign to the 5 Milwaukee public school boards the authority to employ their own personnel, to develop their own budgets, and to develop their own curriculum subject to the approval of the Milwaukee School Districts Governing Board.
- (d) In its recommendations, the commission shall assign to the Milwaukee Public School Districts Governing Board only those powers and duties that are best exercised on a city-wide basis, such as food service, pupil transportation, special education, the receipt of general state aid, the disbursement of such aid to the 5 school districts, the approval of each Milwaukee public school board's curriculum, the authority to implement changes in the boundaries of the 5 school districts and the authority to issue bonds and levy taxes on behalf of the 5 school districts.

(e) The commission shall also include in its recommendations a plan for the
implementation of subsection (1) (d).
(5) DISTRICT ADVISORY COUNCILS. By January 1, 1997, the state superintendent
of public instruction shall appoint a 15-member advisory council for each Milwaukee
public school district. Each council shall prepare a plan for the operation of the school
district and shall submit the plan to the school board of the appropriate Milwaukee
public school district when it takes office in July, 1998.
SECTION 5. Effective dates. This act takes effect on the day after publication,
except as follows:
(1) The treatment of sections 119.01 and 119.02 (1) and (2) and chapter 119
(title) of the statutes and Section 4 (1) of this act take effect on July 1, 1998.
