2            doctoral programs.

3            Whereas, for decades the University of Wisconsin-Madison (UW-Madison) has  
4     been ranked among the top universities in the United States, with undergraduate  
5     and graduate students alike benefiting from its dedication to excellence in teaching,  
6     research and public service; and

7            Whereas, UW-Madison's tradition of excellence continues to be recognized  
8     with an announcement in September by the prestigious National Research Council  
9     (NRC) that 16 doctoral programs at UW-Madison rank among the nation's top 10 in  
10    their respective fields; and

11           Whereas, an additional 19 UW-Madison doctoral programs rank among the 25  
12    best in the nation, as reported in a comprehensive analysis conducted by the NRC  
13    every 10 years; and

14           Whereas, overall, the quality of UW-Madison's doctoral programs ranks  
15    among the top 10 of 274 doctorate-granting public and private universities included  
16    in the nationwide survey; and
