



## 2009 SENATE BILL 168

April 14, 2009 – Introduced by Senators TAYLOR, COGGS and GROTHMAN, cosponsored by Representatives MOLEPSKE JR., BROOKS, TURNER, YOUNG and A. WILLIAMS, by request of Department of Regulation and Licensing. Referred to Committee on Labor, Elections and Urban Affairs.

1     **AN ACT** *to renumber and amend* 454.10 (3) of the statutes; **relating to:**  
2             supervision of barber or cosmetologist apprentices.

***Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau***

Under current law, a person may learn barbering or cosmetology through an apprenticeship. No apprentice may practice barbering or cosmetology except under the supervision of a licensed manager. This bill permits a licensed manager to delegate supervisory authority over an apprentice to a licensed barber or cosmetologist who has completed at least 2,000 hours of practice as a licensed barber or cosmetologist.

***The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:***

3             **SECTION 1.** 454.10 (3) of the statutes is renumbered 454.10 (3) (a) and amended  
4     to read:  
5             454.10 **(3)** (a) No apprentice may practice barbering or cosmetology except  
6     under the supervision of a licensed manager or under the supervision of a licensed

1 barber or cosmetologist to whom supervisory authority has been delegated by a  
2 licensed manager. A licensed manager may only delegate supervisory authority to  
3 a licensed barber or cosmetologist who has completed at least 2,000 hours of practice  
4 as a licensed barber or cosmetologist.

5 (b) Apprentices shall be trained in all branches of practical work and in all  
6 subjects required to be taught in schools of barbering or cosmetology as prescribed  
7 by the examining board by rule.
