



## 2009 SENATE BILL 410

December 2, 2009 - Introduced by Senators COGGS and TAYLOR, cosponsored by Representatives YOUNG, TURNER, BERCEAU, A. WILLIAMS, BARCA, PASCH and FIELDS. Referred to Committee on Transportation, Tourism, Forestry, and Natural Resources.

1     **AN ACT** *to create* 84.1051 of the statutes; **relating to:** designating and marking  
2             a portion of I 43 in the city of Milwaukee as the Jeannetta Simpson-Robinson  
3             Memorial Highway.

***Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau***

Under current law, certain highway routes and bridges have been designated and marked to memorialize, commemorate, or recognize certain individuals, groups, or events. This bill directs the Department of Transportation (DOT) to designate and mark a portion of the route of I 43 within the city of Milwaukee as the “Jeannetta Simpson-Robinson Memorial Highway” in recognition and appreciation of the good works of Jeannetta Simpson-Robinson, a lifelong community leader and activist, who championed the poor, the disadvantaged, children, and peaceful non-violent resolutions to conflicts.

4             **SECTION 1.** 84.1051 of the statutes is created to read:
