2017 SENATE BILL 533

November 8, 2017 - Introduced by Senators PETROWSKI and ERPENBACH, cosponsored by Representatives ROHRKASTE and KOLSTE. Referred to Committee on Public Benefits, Licensing and State-Federal Relations.

1 **AN ACT** *to amend* 450.062 (intro.); and *to create* 450.03 (1) (i) of the statutes;
2 **relating to:** delegation of the practice of pharmacy and granting rule-making
3 authority.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Generally, under current law, no person may engage in the practice of pharmacy unless the person is licensed as a pharmacist. This bill creates an exception to this prohibition for a person who is providing services as directed, supervised, and inspected by a pharmacist, subject to any rules promulgated by the Pharmacy Examining Board.

The bill also specifically allows such a person acting under a pharmacist, as well as a pharmacy student who has completed at least two years of pharmacy studies and a person who has completed pharmacy studies but whose application for licensure as a pharmacist is pending with the board, to engage in remote dispensing of prescribed drugs.
