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## 2019 SENATE BILL 218

May 15, 2019 - Introduced by Senators COWLES, L. TAYLOR and WIRCH, cosponsored by Representatives KUGLITSCH, NEYLON, KITCHENS, KRUG, KULP, MILROY, MURSAU, PETRYK and TUSLER. Referred to Committee on Economic Development, Commerce and Trade.

1     **AN ACT to amend** 20.445 (1) (b), 106.27 (2g) (a) 2. and 106.27 (3); and **to create**  
2             106.27 (1y) of the statutes; **relating to:** reimbursement grants to employers for  
3             payment of costs for certification programs in solar energy and wind energy  
4             systems.

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*Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau*

This bill requires the Department of Workforce Development to allocate \$1,000,000 biennially for grants to train and certify individuals in solar energy and wind energy systems.

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*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

5             **SECTION 1.** 20.445 (1) (b) of the statutes is amended to read:  
6             20.445 (1) (b) *Workforce training; programs, grants, and services.* The amounts  
7             in the schedule for the workforce training programs, grants, and services under s.  
8             106.27 (1), (1g), (1j), ~~and (1r)~~, and (1y).

**SENATE BILL 218****SECTION 2**

1           **SECTION 2.** 106.27 (1y) of the statutes is created to read:

2           106.27 (1y) SOLAR AND WIND ENERGY SYSTEMS EMPLOYERS; CERTIFICATION  
3 COMPLETION GRANTS. (a) In this subsection, “applicant” means a single employer or  
4 a consortium of employers.

5           (b) Of the amounts appropriated under s. 20.445 (1) (b), the department shall  
6 allocate \$1,000,000 in each fiscal biennium for grants to partially reimburse  
7 applicants for costs that they incur for individuals to participate in certification  
8 programs in the installation, repair, or maintenance of solar energy systems or wind  
9 energy systems. The department shall give preference to consortiums of employers  
10 when awarding grants. The maximum cumulative amount an applicant may be  
11 awarded in all years under this subsection is \$250,000. An applicant shall provide  
12 matching funds equal to the amount of the grant awarded.

13           (c) The department shall ensure that a certification program for which an  
14 applicant receives a grant under this section does all of the following:

15           1. Enrolls at least 25 individuals.

16           2. Provides an individual who successfully completes the program with a  
17 certificate or other credential in the installation, repair, or maintenance of solar  
18 energy systems or wind energy systems.

19           **SECTION 3.** 106.27 (2g) (a) 2. of the statutes is amended to read:

20           106.27 (2g) (a) 2. Receive and review applications for grants under subs. (1),  
21 (1g), ~~and (1j) (am), and (1y),~~ and prescribe the form, nature, and extent of the  
22 information that must be contained in an application for a grant under sub. (1), (1g),  
23 ~~or (1j) (am), or (1y).~~

24           **SECTION 4.** 106.27 (3) of the statutes is amended to read:

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1           106.27 (3) ANNUAL REPORT. Annually, by December 31, the department shall  
2 submit a report to the governor and the cochairpersons of the joint committee on  
3 finance providing an account of the department's activities and expenditures under  
4 this section during the preceding fiscal year and detailing the amounts allocated to  
5 and expended for each of the programs, grants, and services specified in s. 20.445 (1)  
6 (b) and (bm) for that fiscal year. The report shall include information on the number  
7 of unemployed and underemployed workers and incumbent employees who  
8 participate in training programs under sub. (1) or (1j); the number of unemployed  
9 workers who obtain gainful employment, underemployed workers who obtain new  
10 employment, and incumbent employees who receive increased compensation after  
11 participating in such a training program; and the wages earned by those workers and  
12 employees both before and after participating in such a training program. The report  
13 shall also include information on the extent to which waiting lists for enrollment in  
14 courses and programs provided by technical colleges in high-demand fields are  
15 reduced as a result of grants under sub. (1g) (a), on the number of students who  
16 participate in certification or training programs under sub. (1) (a) or (e) or (1g) (b),  
17 on the building modifications funded under sub. (1) (f) and the effect of those building  
18 modifications on the school districts' technical education programs, and on the  
19 number of persons with disabilities who participate in employment enhancement  
20 activities under sub. (1g) (c). ~~In addition, the~~ The report shall provide information  
21 on the number of student interns who are placed with employers as a result of the  
22 coordination activities conducted under sub. (1r) or the grants awarded under sub.  
23 (1) (d). In addition, the report shall include the number of individuals who  
24 participated in a certification program described in sub. (1y) (b), the cost of each  
25 individual's participation, the number of individuals who received a certificate or
