

Duty of treasurer.

SEC. 7. That the county treasurer shall do and perform all acts and duties that are now by law required of the county collector, which do not conflict with the provisions of this act.

Per centage of treasurer.

SEC. 8. That the county treasurer shall be allowed one per centum on all monies by him received or collected on the tax duplicate, not otherwise provided for in this act, in addition to the fees now allowed him by law.

Office of collector abolished.

SEC. 9. That the office of county collector, in the county of Grant, is hereby abolished.

SEC. 10. That this act shall take effect from and after the first Monday of January next.

AN ACT

To legalize the official acts of S. F. Seabury and Moses W. Rowley.

Be it enacted by the Council and House of Representatives of the Territory of Wisconsin:

SECTION 1. That the official acts of S. F. Seabury, while acting as a justice of the peace, for the county of Iowa, shall not be deemed invalid on account of any informality or illegality in the election of said Seabury, but his said acts shall be as legal and binding as if his election had been in all respects conformable to law.

SEC. 2. That the acts of Moses W. Rowley, a justice of the peace in and for the county of Dodge, shall not be considered illegal on account of any illegality, or informality in his election, but all his acts shall be as binding as if his election had been legal in all respects.

AN ACT

To provide for laying out certain territorial roads therein named.

Be it enacted by the Council and House of Representatives of the Territory of Wisconsin :

SECTION 1. That N. F. Hyer, D. L. Mills, and M. H. Dickinson, be, and they hereby are appointed commissioners to lay out and establish a territorial road, commencing at ^{Janesville to} Madison. Janesville, thence on the nearest and most direct practicable route, by Stone's bridge, Catfish mills, and Dunkirk, to Madison, in Dane county.

SEC. 2. That Jacob F. Adriance, Benjamin Seabring, and Barton Sailsbury, be, and they are hereby appointed commissioners to lay out a territorial road from ^{Grafton to} Grafton, Washington county, to ^{Fond du Lac.} Fond du Lac, in Fond du Lac county, by such direct route as they shall find to be most feasible.
