An act to appropriate the several sums therein named.

Chap 162

THE People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. That there is hereby appropriated out of the state treasury, out of any moneys not otherwise set apart or appropriated, the following sums, to wit: To Smith and Tredway the sum of one hundred and forty dollars and eighty-three cents, as by account rendered up to December, A. D. 1849. Smith and Tredway.

SEC. 2. To E. F. Herzberg the sum of eighty-five dollars, for

- J. C. Fairchild. SEC. 3. To J. C. Fairchild the sum of thirty-three dollars fifty-eight cents, by account rendered up to January twelfth, 1849.
- J. Atherton. SEC. 4. To Joseph Atherton the sum of two hundred and thirty-one dollars, for seventy days' services in locating school lands, as by account rendered up to the twenty-fifth day of January, 1849.
- D. Clark. SEC. 5. To Darwin Clark the sum of thirty-six dollars, for chairs furnished for the use of the supreme court room, as by account dated January eight, 1849.
- H. A. Tenney SEC. 6. To H. A. Tenney the sum of three hundred thirty-six dollars, for eight thousand and four hundred copies of the Argus, containing the laws passed at the last session of the territorial legislature, in pursuance of a law approved February 22, 1845.
- P. W. Matts. SEC. 7. To Peter W. Matts the sum of seventy-two dollars, for twenty-nine days attendance on the supreme court, at two dollars fifty cents per day, for the session held January, 1849.
- H. C. Parker SEC. 8. To Henry C. Parker the sum of thirty-five dollars, for secretary and bureau furnished to the clerk of the supreme court.
- Hale and Chapman. SEC. 9. To Hale and Chapman the sum of eight dollars and fifty cents, for articles furnished the library, as by account rendered June thirtieth, 1848.
- E. F. Herzberg. SEC. 10. To Ernest F. Hertzburg the sum of eighteen dollars, for six days services in locating school lands, as by account rendered.
- H. G. Bliss. SEC. 11. To H. G. Bliss the sum of twenty-one dollars and three cents, for articles furnished in repairing the capitol and furniture of the state, as by account rendered up to July 27, A. D. 1848.
- L. H. Seaver. SEC. 12. To Lyman H. Seaver the sum of ten dollars, that being the balance due him for services as sergeant-at-arms to the senate during its last session.
- P. Aldrich. SEC. 13. That the sum of one hundred and eighty dollars be, and the same is hereby appropriated to Philip Aldrich, for sixty days' service as commissioner in locating state lands; said appropriation to be paid by the state treasurer, on the presentation of a certificate from the governor that said service has been performed, and returns made agreeably to the provisions of law.
- J. Helpin. SEC. 14. To James Helpin, for work done in and about the capitol during the present session of the legislature, the sum of two hundred and seven dollars and fifty cents.
