An Act to authorize the laying out of a State Road therein named.

Chap. 338

*The People of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. That Horace Duryee, C. B. Strong, and M. M. Maughs, be, and they are hereby appointed commissioners

to lay out and establish a state road, commencing at the village of Norris, and running by the most direct and feasible route to Strong's Tavern, thence to Maughs' Mill, and thence to Prairie La Cross, on the Mississippi river, in La Cross county.

SEC. 2. Horace Duryee, Jacob Rogers, and Thomas Western, are hereby appointed commissioners, and are hereby authorized to lay out and establish a state road, commencing at Adams, in Sauk county, and thence running on the most feasible route through the village of Norris, thence by Carpenter and Rogers' Mill on the Lemmonware river, thence by Western & Co.'s Mill on the Yellow river, and terminating at Grand Rapids on the Wisconsin river in Portage county.

SEC. 3. The said commissioners shall receive for the laying out of said roads such compensation as the supervisors of the several counties through which the road runs may determine. Provided, that no money in the state treasury shall be appropriated therefor.
