An Act in relation to the financial affairs of the City of Milwaukee.

Chap 154

The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. The common council of the city of Milwaukee shall have power to borrow on the faith of said city any sum or sums of money not exceeding in the aggregate the total amount of the delinquent taxes due from said city to the county of Milwaukee and the state of Wisconsin, and of interest coming due on outstanding bonds of said city, during the year 1852. Authorized to borrow money.

SEC. 2. The said sum or sums of money shall be borrowed for any term or terms not less than five nor more than ten years, and at such rate or rates of interest not exceeding ten per cent. per annum, as said council may deem expedient. Terms of loan.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.
