Chap 176

The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to John Warren Hunt, out of any moneys in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of three hundred dollars, in full for balance due him for services in the office of the secretary of state, for the year 1851, employed in pursuance of the provisions of an act of the legislature, approved March 17, 1851.

An Act to appropriate to Charles G. Mayers the sum therein named.

Chap 177

The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to Charles G. Mayers, to be paid out of any moneys in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of fifty dollars, in full for services as clerk in the office of the state superintendent, for the year 1851, employed in pursuance of the provisions of an act of the legislature, approved March 17, 1851.

An Act granting to Robert Wakeley the right to keep a Ferry across the Wisconsin River.

Chap 178

The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. Robert Wakeley, his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, shall have the exclusive right and privilege, for the period of ten years from the passage of this act, of keeping and maintaining a ferry across the Wisconsin river, on section fifteen, (15,) in township twenty-one, Authorized to maintain ferry.

(21,) north of range five, (5,) east of the fourth principal meridian, in Portage county, Wisconsin.

Fees for crossing.

SEC. 2. The said ferry shall be subject to such regulations as other ferries are or may be by law subject, and the proprietor thereof shall be entitled to take and receive for crossing over said river, on said ferry, for any vehicle drawn by two horses or one yoke of oxen, fifty cents; for one horse and a wagon, thirty cents; for each additional horse or ox, fifteen cents; for man and horse, twenty-five cents; for cattle or horses in droves, five cents each: *Provided*, hogs and sheep shall not be charged more than three cents each; and for foot passengers, ten cents each.

SEC. 3. No ferry shall be granted or licensed within one mile of the place where the above provided ferry shall be established.

To provide boat.

SEC. 4. It shall be the duty of the said Robert Wakeley, his heirs or assigns, within one year, to provide a boat at the place above mentioned, sufficient to cross passengers and teams, and within two years from the passage of this act put in complete operation a good and commodious ferry boat at said place, or forfeit all rights under this act.

SEC. 5. Any future legislature may alter, amend or repeal this act.
