An Act for the relief of certain School Districts therein named.

The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Chap 212

SECTION 1. The treasurer of school districts number one and four, in the town of Dunkirk and county of Dane, are hereby authorized to make a new statement of the unpaid taxes in said districts, for the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty, and to make return of the same to the town clerk; and such statement and return shall be in form and substance as is required by the seventy-first section of the act relating to common schools.

To make new statement.

SEC. 2. The town clerk of the above said town of Dunkirk is hereby authorized to enter the above said unpaid taxes in the next assessment roll of the town, to be collected in the same manner as town and county taxes are collected, and when collected, to be paid over to the town superintendent of said town, who shall pay the same over to

Chap 213

An Act to provide for the apportionment of Library Money among School Districts or the year 1852.

The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

To apportion
library money.

SECTION 1. It shall be the duty of the town superintendents of the several towns of this state, to apportion the library money to the several districts of their several towns, in the same manner as they would have done if such districts had complied with the provisions of section forty-four of chapter nineteen of the revised statutes relating to library money and library regulations.

SEC. 2. This act shall continue in force until the first Monday in June next, and no longer.

Chap 214

An Act in relation to the admission of Attorneys.

The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Attorneys of supreme court of Illinois authorized to practice in this state.

SECTION 1. That any citizen of the United States authorized to practice as an attorney in the supreme court of the state of Illinois, may be admitted to practice as an attorney and counsellor and solicitor in chancery in all courts of record in this state, on motion signed by such person, as
