The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to E. B. and E. C. Quiner, out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of twenty-eight dollars and seventy-five cents, in full, for publishing, by order of the secretary of state, advertisement of delinquent canal land mortgages, and notice of election, in the second judicial circuit in the year 1851.

Chap. 33.

An Act to appropriate to John White the sum therein named.

The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. That there is hereby appropriated to John White ten hundred and fifty-five dollars and ninety-eight cents, in full for keeping of state prisoners to January 1st, 1852, to wit: David Bonham, John Myers, Seth Rogers, Joseph Conrad, Beltaser Conrad, Frederick Thuerman, Peter Duffy, Augustus C. Lawson, Patrick Maroney, and furnishing the same with medicines, clothing, and fuel, and for the

board of night watchers, to be paid out of any funds in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated.

An Act to organize the county of Waushara for judicial purposes.

Chap. 34.

The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

When organized SECTION 1. From and after the first day of March next the county of Waushara shall be fully organized for judicial purposes, and shall enjoy all the rights and privileges appertaining to other counties so organized in this state.

Made part of third circuit. SEC. 2. Said county of Waushara shall be, and is hereby constituted a part of the third judicial circuit; and two terms of the circuit court shall be holden annually in said county, at the county seat thereof, to wit: on the first Monday of April, and the second Monday of October annually. There shall be four terms of the county court annually in said county, to wit: on the first Mondays in April, July, October, and January.

How writs returnable. SEC. 3. All writs shall issue and be made returnable as required by law in other counties; and all laws now in force, applicable to the summoning and empanneling of jurors shall be applicable to, and in force in the said county of Waushara.

SEC. 4. This act to be in force from and after the first day of March, 1852.
