Sec. 2. The said corporation may have a common seal which they may alter or renew at pleasure.

Sec. 3. Any six of the above named persons may call a meeting of said association for the purpose of organizing,

Bow organises, by publishing a notice of the time, place, and objects of such meeting, for two successive weeks, in the Western Star, and by posting up copies of such notice in three public places in the town of Troy, in the county of Walworth, in which town said meeting shall be held and said incorporation be located.

Sec. 4. At the first, or any subsequent legally notified meeting, the said persons above named and their associates. if a majority of them are present, shall have power to elect so many trustees and such officers as they may determine upon.

Sec. 5. The purpose of this incorporation is to provide Object of corpo. for the education, mental and moral discipline, and instruction in literature, science and arts, of students in the said academy; and the said incorporation may make such rules, regulations, and by-laws, and vest in the said trustees and their successors, such powers as they may deem necessary to effect the said purposes, and which shall not be inconsistent therewith, or with law.

SEC. 6. This act may be amended or repealed by this.
