Purchase money not to be exacted.

Proviso.

SEC. 7. The commissioners of school and university lands shall not be required to exact any portion of the purchase money at the time of the sale of any tract as directed in section 10, chapter 24 of the revised statutes: *Provided*, Additional security be given by the purchaser sufficient to protect the fund against loss from any diminution of the value of the said tract by trespass, waste, or otherwise.

SEC. 8. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.

Chap 494

An Act relating to the survey of swamp and overflowed lands.

The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

To employ surveyors.

SECTION 1. The governor of the state is hereby authorized and empowered and required to employ such number of skillful and practical surveyors as he may deem necessary to make an actual and personal survey and report of all overflowed lands granted to this state by act of congress of the United States approved September 28, 1850: *Provided*, The expenses of such surveys shall be reimbursed to the treasury out of the first sales of such lands.

Proviso.

Surveys to be furnished.

SEC. 2. The governor shall cause to be furnished to such surveyors such copies of the original minutes of surveys made under authority of the United States as may be necessary, and the said surveyors shall survey and run such lines only as may be necessary to enable them definitely and truly to ascertain the designation of each section and part of section of such overflowed lands.

Governor to ascertain amount of lands.

SEC. 3. The governor is also authorized and required to take all necessary measures to ascertain the amount of swamp and overflowed lands granted to this state by the act aforesaid, which may already have been or hereafter may be disposed of by the United States since the passage of said act, and to draw and receive from the treasury of the United States all such sums of money as may be justly due from the United States on account of the disposal

of any such lands, and pay the money so received into the treasury of this state.

SEC. 4. It shall be the duty of the governor to ascertain and select all the swamp and overflowed lands granted to this state by act aforesaid, already surveyed and not heretofore selected and approved by the authorities of the United States, or as may be hereafter surveyed from time to time, and cause entries thereof to be made in the name of the state of Wisconsin at the proper land offices of the United States, and to procure suitable books for the state, and to cause to be recorded therein descriptive lists of all the subdivisions of said lands, to procure copies of all such township plats of the United States surveys of lands in this state, as he may deem necessary for the use of the state in carrying into effect all the provisions of this act.

SEC. 5. It shall be the duty of the governor to cause to be marked on such township plats or on a sectional map of the state which he is authorized to procure for that purpose, all the lands belonging to this state by virtue of said grants.

SEC. 6. There is hereby appropriated, out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of three thousand dollars, to be drawn from the treasury on the warrants of the governor as may be necessary to defray the expenses of carrying into effect the provisions and purposes of this act: *Provided*, The expenses of such surveys and expenses shall be re-imbursed to the treasury out of the first sales of such lands.

An Act to provide for the laying out of a certain State Road therein named.

The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Alvin Foster, Narcissa M. Juneau, and Mr. Statchinson, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to lay out and establish a state road from the village of Juneau, in the county of Dodge, through the village of Horicon, Mayville, Theresa, Cranchville, Cascade, to the village of Sheboygan, in the county of Sheboygan:
