

revised statutes, is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Whenever application shall be made by any free-holder whose land is excluded from the highway, to the supervisors of the town, to lay out a private road, the supervisors may lay out such road; and the damages thereof to any owner of the lands through which such road may be laid, shall in like manner be ascertained and determined, and in case of appeal, the like proceedings shall be had thereon, as is provided in this chapter, for the laying out and altering of public highways; except that the applicant for such private road shall, in all cases, pay the damages and costs, arising from the laying out of such road.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force, from and after its passage.

An Act prescribing certain duties of Clerks of Circuit Courts, and for other purposes. Chap. 19.

*The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. It shall be the duty of the clerk of the circuit court to keep an accurate list, in a book to be by him provided for that purpose, of all certificates by him issued to witnesses and jurors; stating in such record the number of each certificate, the date and amount thereof, and to whom issued; and to furnish at each annual session of the county board of supervisors, a certified transcript of such record during the year preceding such session; which transcript shall be entered in full upon the records of said board.

An Act to provide for the payment of the Surveying of School Lands in the several Counties of this State. Chap. 20.

*The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. There shall be allowed to the surveyors who were employed by the appraisers of the school lands in the counties of Sauk, Adams, Waushara, Waupacca,
