## Chap. 71.

AN ACT *to provide for an increase of the salary of the Private Secretary of the Governor.*

Published, April 22, 1854.

*The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :*

§ 1. The salary of the private secretary of the government is hereby fixed at one thousand dollars per annum, to be paid quarterly, in the same manner as other salaries are paid; and the said sum of one thousand dollars per annum is hereby appropriated for that purpose, to be paid out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, and the office of private secretary is hereby established. Salary increased.

§ 2. So much of section eight of chapter nine of the revised statutes, as refers to the clerk hire of the executive department is hereby repealed.

§ 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
