

CHAPTER 100.

An Act to provide for defraying the expenses of the Investigating Committee.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

Expense of
investigating
committee—
secretary to
audit.

SECTION 1. The committee of investigation are hereby authorized to certify to the secretary of state, the accounts for such expenses as they may incur for clerk hire and attendance of witnesses, during the recess of the legislature, and thereupon it shall be the duty of the secretary of state to audit such accounts, and order the same to be paid out of the state treasury : *Provided*, The compensation of witnesses shall be two dollars per day, and six cents for each mile traveled.

Appropriation

SEC. 2. There is hereby appropriated, to be paid out of the state treasury, a sum of money sufficient to pay the accounts audited under the provisions of the first section of this act. This act to take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

An Act to amend chapter eighty-four of the Revised Statutes of Wisconsin, entitled "of Courts of Chancery and proceedings therein."

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

Amendment.

SECTION 1. Section thirty-six of chapter eighty-four of the revised statutes is amended hereby by adding to said section the following proviso, to wit : *Provided*, That this section, thirty six, shall not be so construed as in any way
