

CHAPTER 42.

An Act requiring County Superintendents of the Poor to give security for the performance of their duties.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. Every county superintendent of the poor, who shall hereafter be elected under and in pursuance of section thirty three, of chapter twenty eight of the revised statutes, shall within ten days after notice of his election, and before entering upon the duties of his office, execute to the county board of supervisors of his county, his bond with two or more sufficient sureties, to be approved by said board of supervisors, and in such penal sum as the said board shall direct, which bond, with the approval of the board endorsed thereon by their clerk, shall be filed with said clerk ; such bond shall be conditioned in substance that he will faithfully and properly perform all the duties of the office of county superintendent of the poor, and will pay over and disburse according to law, all moneys that shall come to his hands as such superintendent, and that he will render a just and true account thereof whenever required by the county board of supervisors, or by any provisions of law, and will deliver over to his successor, or to any other person or persons authorized by law to receive the same, all moneys, books, papers and other things appertaining or belonging to his said office.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect from and after its passage and publication.
