

**Chap. 39.**

Published, April 22, 1857.

AN ACT to pay for Stationery.

*The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

§ 1. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of five thousand seven hundred and sixty-one 42-100 dollars, to pay for the stationery heretofore purchased and not paid for. The money hereby appropriated to be drawn from the Treasury upon the order of the Governor, and to be paid by him to the persons having such claims against the State, or to the Superintendent of Public Property, upon filing with the Governor their claims receipted in full. Appropriation for stationery.

§ 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

**Chap. 40.**

AN ACT to provide for a Geological and Agricultural Survey of the State.

*The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

§ 1. James Hall of Albany, N. Y., and Ezra S. Carr and Edward Daniels of Wisconsin, are hereby designated and appointed Commissioners to make a Geological, Mineralogical and Agricultural Survey of the State, embracing a scientific and descriptive survey of the rocks, fossils and minerals of the State, full and complete essays of the ore and minerals, also of the soils and subsoils, with the classification and description of the Commissioners appointed to make survey.
