AN ACT to provide for indexing and transcribing the Journals of the Senate and Assembly.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

Appropriation for indexing and transcribing journals.

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to John L. V. Thomas, Chief Clerk of the Senate, and Louis H. D. Crane, Chief Clerk of the Assembly, the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars each, in full, for indexing the journals of the present session of the legislature; also, to George H. Hand, Transcribing Clerk of the Senate, and John S. Dean, Transcribing Clerk of the Assembly, the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars each, as compensation in full for completing the transcribing of the journals of the present session; *Provided*, That this appropriation shall not be drawn from the treasury until the work is completed, and certified to by the Secretary of State.

Proviso.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Chapter 121.

AN ACT to provide for levying a State Tax for 1858.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

State tax of \$350,000 levied—\$250,000 for expenses of 1859, and \$100,000 for deficiencies.

SECTION 1. There shall be levied and collected for the year 1858 a State tax of three hundred and fifty thousand dollars, as follows: Two hundred and fifty thousand dollars for the estimated expenses of the year 1859, and one hundred thousand dollars to pay the deficiency of former years, to be apportioned among and assessed
