

## Chapter 15.

*Published February 27th, 1858.*

**AN ACT** to divide the County of Dunn, and create the County of Pepin.

*The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

- Boundary line**    **SECTION 1.** That all that portion of territory embraced in the county of Dunn south of the township line between towns twenty five (25), and twenty six (26), is hereby set off into a separate county, which shall be called and known as the county of Pepin.
- When organized.**    **SEC. 2.** That the county of Pepin aforesaid, shall be organized on the fourth day of March next, for the purposes of county government, and for judicial purposes, and shall enjoy all the rights, privileges, immunities and powers of the other counties in this State.
- Governor to appoint officers.**    **SEC. 3.** That before the fourth day of March next the Governor shall appoint in and for said county of Pepin, county officers, who shall, on the said fourth day of March, qualify and enter upon the duties of their several offices, and hold the same until the first day of January succeeding the next general election.
- County seat.**    **SEC. 4.** The seat of justice for said county shall be and is hereby located on sections twenty five (25), in township twenty three (23), range fifteen (15) west, in said county of Pepin.
- Circuit court when held.**    **SEC. 5.** The circuit court in and for said county, shall be holden on the first Monday of December and last Monday in May in each year, until otherwise provided by law.
- SEC. 6.** This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
