AN ACT relating to the Crime of Perjury.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. Every person who shall knowingly and intentionally swear falsely as to any material fact concerning which he may on oath testify before any legislative committee, is hereby declared guilty of perjury, and the offender, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by imprisonment in the State prison, for a term not less than six months, nor more than five years. Perjury—
punishment.

SEC. 2. This act, immediately after the passage thereof, shall be printed by the State printer, and when so published shall take effect.

AN ACT to provide for the payment of the Clerks of the Joint Standing Committees of Investigation.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State treasury not otherwise appropriated, a sum sufficient to pay for the services of the clerks of the joint standing committee of investigation into the State departments; *Provided*, The per diem of the chief clerks employed by said committees shall not exceed the sum of three dollars per day, and of all other clerks Money appro-
