CHAPTER 185.

AN ACT to construe chapter twenty, of the revised statutes, entitled
“of regulating fences.” *

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. The powers conferred upon the board of **Explanatory.**
supervisors of the several counties by chapter twenty, of
the revised statutes, entitled “of the regulation of fences,” shall be so construed, as to authorize such boards
to grant licenses for the keeping and maintaining of fences
to railroad companies incorporated by any law of this
state, and any railroad to which such license may be
granted, shall have and enjoy all the rights and privileges
which may be possessed and enjoyed by individuals under
such license; *Provided*, that no license shall be **Proviso.**
granted to any railroad company to maintain a fence, except
upon waters crossed by such road, or at the terminus
thereof.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect from and after its **Take effect.**
passage and publication.

CHAPTER 186.

AN ACT to amend chapter 154, of the revised statutes, entitled “of
the foreclosure of mortgages by advertisement.”

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. Section eleven, of chapter 154, of the re- **Amendment.**
vised statutes, is hereby amended by striking out of the
third line of said section the word “two,” and insert the
word “one,” in lieu thereof.
