

CHAPTER 288.

AN ACT legalizing a State Road therein named.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

Acts of Com-

galized.

SECTION 1. That the acts of the commissioners in laying out a State road, as provided in chapter 79, of the Private and Local Laws of 1857, by an act, entitled "An act for laying out a State road from Sparta, Monroe county, to the county seat of Clark county," are hereby legalized, and the road as surveyed and platted by them, is declared a public highway, and said commissioners, so acting, shall be entitled to receive such compensation for their services as is provided for in said act.

§ 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 289.

AN ACT to provide for laying out a State Road from Sections 14 and 15, Town 22, Range 21, to the city of Green Bay.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

Commissioners

SECTION 1. Frederick S. Ellis, Dennis J. F. Murphy and Patrick Sweeney, are hereby appointed commissioners to lay out and establish a State road, beginning at the quarter stake, between sections fourteen and fifteen, in town twenty-two, range twenty-one east, to the city of Green Bay, Brown county, and State of Wisconsin.

§ 2. Said commissioners shall, immediately after, laying out said road, cause a report of their survey to be made and filed with the clerk of the board of supervisors of the counties through which said road passes, and in all respects comply with the provisions of chapter nineteen of the Revised Statutes, so far as the same are applicable.
