

CHAPTER 256.

[Published April 19, 1861.]

AN ACT to enable the city of Madison to arrange and settle its indebtedness, and for other purposes.

(See Supplement to Local Laws.)

CHAPTER 257.

[Published April 24, 1861.]

AN ACT to amend Chapter 317 of the Private and Local Laws of 1860, entitled "An act to amend an act to incorporate the city of Sheboygan, and the several acts amendatory thereof."

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section six of chapter three hundred and seventeen of the private and local laws of 1860, is hereby amended by adding to said section the following: *And further provided*, that the gross amount of taxes so levied for such purposes in any one year, shall not exceed the sum of four thousand and five hundred dollars. Limit to taxes.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 258.

[Published April 19, 1861.]

AN ACT to amend an act entitled "An act to change the time for holding elections in the city of Hudson," approved March 16th, 1860.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section one of an act to change the time for holding elections in the city of Hudson, ap- When annual election to be held.

proved March 16th, 1860, is hereby amended so as to read as follows: The annual election in the said city of Hudson for such city officers as are to be elected, shall be held on the first Tuesday of April in each year, instead of the first Monday, as heretofore.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after the first day of May next.

CHAPTER 259.

[Published April 24, 1861.]

AN ACT to authorize the Commissioners of School and University Lands, to procure certain blanks for the use of the Land Office.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Township plats. SECTION 1. The commissioners of school and university lands are hereby authorized to procure for the use of the land office, 2,000 lithographed blank township plats, at an expense not to exceed one hundred dollars.

How paid. SECTION 2. The secretary of state is hereby authorized to audit the account for said plats, to be paid equally from the school and swamp land funds, and there is hereby appropriated from said funds an amount sufficient to pay the same.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
