CHAPTER 292.

[Published April 12, 1862.]

AN ACT to provide for the expenditure of the drainage fund in the town of Ahnepee, in Kewaunee county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. For the purpose of draining the swamp lands along the banks of the Ahnepee river, in the county of Kewaunee, the drainage moneys belonging to the town of Ahnepee, in said county, shall be expended in opening the mouth of said Ahnepee river. David Youngs is hereby appointed a commissioner for the purpose of expending such moneys. The said Youngs shall, before entering upon the duties of his appointment, give such bond to the town board of the town of Ahnepee, for the faithful performance of his duties under the provisions of this act, as they may deem proper; and he shall receive for each day actually and necessarily spent by him in the performance of the duties enjoined by this act, the sum of one dollar (*per day*).

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
