

CHAPTER 367.

[Published June 23, 1862.]

AN ACT to change the time of holding terms of the circuit court in Marquette county, and in relation to special terms in the counties of Dodge, Green Lake and Washington, in the third judicial circuit.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

General terms.

SECTION 1. The general terms of the circuit court for the county of Marquette, shall hereafter be held on the fourth Monday of August and the fourth Monday in February, in each year.

Repeal of special term in Washington county, &c.

SECTION 2. So much of sections one and two of chapter eight of the general laws of 1860, as requires the judge to hold special terms of the circuit court in the county of Washington, in July of each year, and section two of chapter 106 of the general laws of 1860, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect from and after its passage and publication, and repeal all acts inconsistent with this act.

CHAPTER 368.

AN ACT relating to special terms of the circuit court in the sixth and fifth judicial circuit, [circuits,] and to change the time for holding the general terms in Marquette county, in the third judicial circuit.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Regular terms in Crawford, La Crosse, Monroe and Jackson counties.

SECTION 1. That the regular terms of the circuit court held in the counties of Crawford, La Crosse, Monroe and Jackson, in the sixth judicial circuit, shall be special terms for the whole of said circuit, for the purpose of hearing and determining all questions of law,
