

any time within thirty days after the passage of this act; and the said justice of the peace shall continue to hold said office and exercise the powers and duties of a justice of the peace during term for which he was elected.

SECTION 2. None of the official acts of said justice of the peace shall be deemed or taken to be invalid or illegal, for the reason that the said justice of the peace had not taken or filed his official oath or executed and filed his official bond within the time and in the manner prescribed by law. Prior acts not  
invalid.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER 401.

[Published June 26, 1862.]

AN ACT to legalize the official acts of Ambrose Spencer, as justice of the peace in the town of Magnolia, and county of Rock.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. That all the official acts of Ambrose Spencer, as justice of the peace of the town of Magnolia, and county of Rock, in this state, prior to the passage of this act, so far as the same are consistent with the general laws of this state, are hereby legalized and declared to be as valid, for all purposes, as though the said Ambrose Spencer had caused his official bond and oath of office to have been made and filed according law. Acts legalized.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
