CHAPTER 138.

[Published March 21, 1864.]

AN ACT to change the name of the village of Stanton, in the county of Portage.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. The name of the village of Stanton, in the county of Portage, is hereby changed to Plover, and it shall hereafter be known in law and otherwise by that name ; and the inhabitants of the district of country described in section one of chapter two hundred and seventy-eight of the private and local laws of 1857, entitled “an act to incorporate the village of Algernon,” and in section one of chapter two hundred and three of the private and local laws of 1858, entitled “an act to amend an act entitled ‘an act to incorporate the village of Algernon,’” shall hereafter be known by the name, style and title of the “president and trustees of the village of Plover.”

Name changed to Plover.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
