CHAPTER 282.

[Published April 18, 1864.]

AN ACT to legalize the acts of a town meeting held in the town of Lebanon, in the county of Waupaca, on the 20th day of February, 1864, at which bounties were voted to persons who may enter or may have entered the military service of the United States.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. The proceeding of a special town meeting of the town of Lebanon, in the county of Waupaca, held on the twentieth day of February, A. D. 1864, at which a bounty was voted to persons who may enter or who may have entered the military service of the United States, to the credit of said town, and the taxes voted to be levied and collected in pursuance thereof, are hereby made and declared to be legal and valid to all intents and purposes, notwithstanding the tax so voted exceeded the amount authorized by law to be levied and collected for such purpose.

Proceedings of meeting legalized.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
