

CHAPTER 320.

[Published April 20, 1864.]

AN ACT to extend to executors and administrators the provisions of chapter one hundred and forty-one of the revised statutes, relating to actions for the recovery of real estate.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Any executor or administrator may proceed by action, pursuant to chapter one hundred and forty-one of the revised statutes, to recover possession of specific real property belonging to the estate represented by him. Recovery of specific real property.

SECTION 2. The complaint in such action shall set forth the nature and extent of the interest which the heirs, devisees or successors in interest of the deceased have in the premises claimed, and that the plaintiff, as such executor or administrator, is entitled to the possession of such premises, and that the defendant unlawfully withholds the possession thereof from him. What complaint to set forth.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 321.

[Published April 20, 1864.]

AN ACT relating to the purchase of books and reports for the state library, and amendatory of section eight of chapter 26 of the revised statutes.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section eight of chapter 26 of the revised statutes of this state, is hereby amended, so as to read as follows: "Section 8. There is hereby annually appropriated to the governor of the state, the sum of five hundred dollars, to be paid to him by the state treasurer, out of any money in the state treasury not Books to amount of \$500 may be purchased annually.

otherwise appropriated, to be expended under the direction and approval of the governor, by the state librarian, in the purchase of such law reports and other books for the state library, as may be deemed necessary or advisable."

Construction.

SECTION 2. Section eight of chapter 26, as amended by section one of this act, shall be construed to appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars for the purpose therein mentioned, for the year 1864, as well as for subsequent years.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 322.

[Published April 20, 1864.]

AN ACT relating to the duties of the secretary of state, and amendatory of section 77 of chapter seven of the revised statutes, entitled "of elections other than for town officers."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

Record of results of elections.

SECTION 1. Section seventy-seven of chapter seven of the revised statutes, entitled "of elections other than for town officers," is hereby amended, so as to read as follows: "Section 77. The secretary of state, upon the receipt of the certified statements of the votes given in the several counties, directed to be sent to him by the clerks of the boards of supervisors, shall record the result of such election by counties, in a suitable book to be kept in his office for that purpose, and shall file and carefully preserve the certified statements so by him received; and if no such statement shall be received by him from the clerk of the board of supervisors of any county, he shall obtain the same as early as practicable from any other source, and when received, shall record and file the same in like manner."

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
