

## CHAPTER 477.

[Published May 7, 1864.]

AN ACT to amend chapter two hundred and forty-eight of the private and local laws of eighteen hundred and fifty-three, entitled "an act to incorporate the Fond du Lac and Mississippi railroad company," and the several acts amendatory thereto.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Chapter two hundred and forty-eight of the private and local laws of eighteen hundred and fifty-three, entitled "an act to incorporate the Fond du Lac and Mississippi railroad company," and the several acts amendatory thereto, are hereby amended, so as to provide that at the next election of directors, and thereafter, nine directors shall be elected instead of seven, as now required by said act; and also, that all notices or publications required by said act to be published in a newspaper published in Fond du Lac, shall also be published in some newspaper in the city of Ripon.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
