

CHAPTER 104.

[Published March 20, 1865.]

AN ACT to provide for laying out a state road from Maiden Rock, in Pierce county, to Menomonee, in Dunn county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Commissioners. SECTION 1. George K. Irvine, Andrew O. Bailey and Hiram N. Wood, are hereby appointed commissioners to lay out and establish a state road from Maiden Rock, in Pierce county, to Menomonee, in Dunn county.

Their compensation. SECTION 2. The said commissioners shall receive for laying out said road such compensation for their services, from the counties through which said road shall pass, as the supervisors of such counties shall deem just and reasonable; but no money shall be paid out of the state treasury therefor.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force on and after its passage.
