SECTION 2. The county treasurer of the county of Buffalo is hereby required to add to the delinquent taxes for the year 1864, the amount returned by the town treasurer of the said town of Glencoe, as delinquent of the special tax voted to be raised by said town at the time mentioned in section one of this act, and the said county treasurer shall proceed with such delinquent taxes so returned, in the same manner as in case of other delinquent taxes returned to him.

SECTION 8. This act shall take effect and be in force

from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 168.

AN ACT to legalize the acts of (a) special town, meetings in the towns of Arlington and Lowville, in the county of Columbia.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in sense and assembly, do enact as follows:

Bounty tax proceedings legalfact.

SECTION 1. The special town meeting in the town of Arlington, held on the 13th day of February, A. D. 1865, and the special town meeting held in the town of Lowville on the 10th day of February, 1865, in the county of Columbia, for the purpose of raising money by tax to pay bounties to volunteers, and incidental expenses, in the military service of the United States, are hereby declared legal and valid for all intents and purposes for which the same were held; and all acts done in pursuance of the vote or votes of said meetings, by the officers of said towns, or any of them, are hereby, declared valid, the same as if the law had been complied with in noticing and conducting said meetings.

SECTION 2. Allacts of the officers of said towns, or either of them, in proceeding to the immediate collection of said tax, are hereby legalized and declared

valid.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
