CHAPTER 288.

AN ACT to provide for expending the license money of the town of Port Washington, Ozaukee county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

To be expended
in improving
streets.

SECTION 1. All moneys derived from the licensing of the sale of strong, spirituous, ardent or intoxicating liquors and drinks, in the town of Port Washington, in the county of Ozaukee, in this state, shall be expended for and applied by the board of supervisors of said town, exclusively for the purpose of making and improving the streets and in the construction of sidewalks in the village of Port Washington, in said county.

Annual street
tax.

SECTION 2. The qualified electors of the said town of Port Washington, shall have power at any annual meeting thereof, to vote to raise by tax such sum of money as they may think proper and reasonable, for the purpose of making and improving the streets and for the construction of sidewalks in said village of Port Washington, and the tax so voted at any such meeting, shall be levied and collected in the same manner as other highway taxes are levied and collected.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
