is hereby authorized and empowered to retain and keep for his own use and benefit, all sums of money collected by or paid, to him as fees for the collection of taxes in said city, not exceeding the sum of twelve hundred dollars, during the term of office commencing in the month of April, A. D. 1864, anything in the charter or amendatory to the charter of said city to the contrary notwithstanding.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.

AN ACT to amend the charter of the Rock river insurance company.

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CHAPTER 70.

[Published March 4, 1865.]

AN ACT to legalize the acts of a special election held on the 4th day of January, 1865, in the city of Beloit, Rock county, Wisconsin, and authorizing the collection of the tax voted at said election.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

Bounty tax proceedings legalized.

SECTION 1. The special election held in the city of Beloit, Rock county, Wisconsin, on the 4th day of January, 1865, for the purpose of raising a special tax to pay bounties to volunteers enlisting into the military service of the United States, is hereby declared legal and valid for all the intents and purposes for which the same was held; and all acts done in pursuance of the vote or votes of said election, by the officers of said city, or any of them, are hereby declared valid; the

same as if the law had been fully complied with in conducting said election: *provided*, that not more than two hundred dollars shall be paid to any volunteer or to any person providing himself with a substitute. Limit to bounty.

SECTION 2. All acts of the officers of said city, and all acts of the common council, or either of them, in proceeding to collect said tax, are hereby legalized and declared valid. Acts of officers legalized.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

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CHAPTER 71.

[Published March 4, 1865.]

AN ACT relating to town officers, and amendatory of section 43 of chapter 16 of the revised statutes:

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section forty-three of chapter fifteen of the revised statutes is hereby amended, by adding thereto the following words, to wit: "which statement shall show the postoffice address of the chairman of the board of supervisors, town treasurer, assessor and town clerk of said town." Postoffice address of town officers.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect when published.
