

GENERAL LAWS.

CHAPTER 1.

[Published January 21, 1867.]

AN ACT to repeal chapter 105 of the general laws of 1866, entitled "an act to regulate the reception of patients into the Wisconsin state hospital for the insane."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. Chapter 105 of the general laws of 1866 is hereby repealed. Repealed.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 2.

[Published January 31, 1867.]

AN ACT to authorize the governor to appoint certain commissioners to represent the state of Wisconsin in the industrial exhibition to be held at Paris in 1867.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. The governor is hereby authorized to appoint Hon. Edward Sakomon, Laura J. Ross, M. D., Wm. Young, I. A. Lapham, LL. D., Joseph Phillip, Wm. Pitt Lynde and Edward Phillip, of Milwaukee, and B. S. Weil, of Washington county, and Ernest Commissioners to Paris exposition.
