

CHAPTER 54.

AN ACT to amend section 4 of chapter 481 of the general laws of 1864, entitled "an act to reduce the expenses of the courts of Milwaukee county."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Amended. SECTION 1. Section four of chapter four hundred and eighty-one (481) of the general laws of 1864, entitled "an act to reduce the expenses of the courts of Milwaukee county," approved April 4th, 1864, is hereby amended, so that said section four will read as follows: "In each case where a jury shall be sworn in the circuit or county courts of Milwaukee county, the jury fee shall be three dollars, which sum shall be paid by the plaintiff before the jury shall be sworn, which jury fee shall be paid into the county treasury, and if he shall neglect to pay the same, the defendant may pay it, or the court shall dismiss the complaint, and render such judgment in favor of the defendant as may be just and proper. Such jury fee shall be taxable as costs in the action, and shall be in lieu of the amount required to be paid to the clerk under section 33 of chapter 133 of the revised statutes. Each grand and petit juror in the circuit, municipal or county courts in Milwaukee county, shall be entitled to receive fifty cents for each mile traveled each way in going to and returning from court, on the most usual route, and a certificate shall be given therefor by the clerk of the court in which such juror may be summoned to attend, such certificate to be paid as heretofore provided by law, out of the county treasury; and no other compensation shall be paid to grand or petit jurors in either of said courts than as provided in this section." And the said chapter four hundred and eighty-one of the general laws of 1864, as amended by this act, is hereby revived, re-enacted and declared to be in full force and effect.
