

CHAPTER 89.

[Published March 9, 1868.]

AN ACT to amend chapter 22 of the laws of 1859, entitled "an act relative to the sale of lands for unpaid taxes and the conveyance and redemption thereof."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section twenty (20) of chapter twenty-two (22) of the general laws of 1859, entitled "an act relative to the sale of lands for unpaid taxes and the conveyance and redemption thereof," is hereby so amended as to read as follows: "Section 20. The lands of minors, or any interest they may have in lands sold for taxes, may be redeemed at any time before such minors come of age, and during one year thereafter; and the lands of idiots, married women, widowed women, and insane persons, so sold, or any interest they may have in the same, may be redeemed at any time within five years after such sale, and such redemption shall be made in the same manner as provided in the last two preceding sections." Amended.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

AN ACT to enable school districts to acquire title to sites for school houses in certain cases.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:
