

payable when the plaster model of said bust is completed, and the remainder when the said bust shall be fully executed and delivered, the supervision of the work and the placing of said bust, to be vested in the governor, the secretary of state and chief justice of the supreme court of the state of Wisconsin, upon whose certificate, at the time above mentioned, the said sum above named shall be paid out of the general fund in the state treasury, on the warrant of the secretary of state.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 58.

[Published March 19, 1870.]

AN ACT to provide stationery and postage stamps for officers and employes of the senate and assembly.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Shall furnish stationery.

SECTION 1. The superintendent of public property is hereby directed to furnish to the several officers, clerks and employes, and also to the clerks of the several committees of the senate and assembly, each, stationery to the amount of fifteen dollars, and postage stamps to the amount of five dollars; and to the messengers of the senate and assembly, each, stationery to the amount of five dollars.

Appropriation.

SECTION 2. There is hereby annually appropriated out of any money in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, a sum sufficient to carry this act into effect.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
