

CHAPTER 3.

[Published February 13, 1872.]

AN ACT to amend section 24 of chapter 17 of the revised statutes, entitled of fences and fence viewers; of pounds and the impounding of cattle.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Amended.

SECTION 1. Section twenty-four of chapter seventeen of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding after the word, "town," where it occurs in said section, the words, "or village," so that the said section, when so amended, shall read as follows: Section 24. If any person shall wilfully injure any pound, maintained by any town or village, he shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding fifty dollars, or by imprisonment in the county jail not exceeding ninety days, at the discretion of the court.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
